SUBMISSIONS: Prisoners and former prisoners are encouraged to submit papers, collaborative essays, discussions transcribed from tape, book reviews, and photo or graphic essays. The *Journal* does not publish fiction or poetry. The *Journal* will publish articles in French, English or Spanish. Articles should be no longer than 20 pages typed and double spaced or legibly handwritten. Writers may elect to write anonymously or under a pseudonym. For references cited in an article, the writer should attempt to provide the necessary bibliographic information. Refer to the references cited in this issue for examples. Submissions are reviewed by an editorial board. Selected articles are corrected for composition and returned to the authors for their approval before publication. Papers not selected are returned with editor's comments. Revised papers may be resubmitted.
